- (3) Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) Only PHA A PHA that administers more than 550 HCVs, was not designated as troubled in its most recent SEMAP assessment, and does not own or manage public housing.
- (4) Standard PHA A PHA that owns or manages 250 or more public housing units and any number of vouchers where the total combined units exceeds 550, and that was designated as a standard performer in the most recent PHAS or SEMAP assessments.
- (5) Troubled PHA A PHA that achieves an overall PHAS or SEMAP score of less than 60 percent.
- (6) Qualified PHA A PHA with 550 or fewer public housing dwelling units and/or housing choice vouchers combined, and is not PHAS or SEMAP troubled.

Goals from 2017 PHA 5-Year Plan

1. Assist persons living in Franklin County whose earnings are 50% less of the median county income limits as the highest priority.

Ongoing activity.

- Develop tenant self-sufficiency opportunities to encourage tenant growth and independence.
 - Applied for the ROSS grant to assist residents with self-sufficiency. Hired a new FSS coordinator and working to expand the reach of participants assisted. Will pursue every avenue to create tenant self-sufficiency.
- 3. Provide educational and recreational activities for the youth of the housing communities.

Work with Boys and Girls Club to expand educational and recreational activities.

- 4. Implement the Housing Authorities newly stated values of Integrity, Service, Accountability and Teamwork.
 - Every employee has signed a commitment to the organization values. Continued integration with staff will be integrated continuously.

5. Maintain the Housing Authority's High Performer status recognized by HUD.

Both Public Housing PHAS and Section 8 SEMAP obtained High Performer status.

6. The Maintenance Department of the Public Housing developments will continually conduct a comprehensive preventative maintenance program for all units – ongoing.

Quarterly preventative maintenance checks for REAC are being performed by maintenance.

7. The Public Housing developments will maintain a yearly average occupancy of 98% to ensure 100% funding of operating subsidy and Capital Fund grant.

Public Housing is currently operating at occupancy that exceeds 98%.

3. The Section 8 program will maintain a SEMAP designation of high performer.

The Section 8 department obtained high performer status for the last fiscal year.

9. Section 8 occupancy will be driven by available Housing Assistance Program funds allocated by the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The program goal is to expend 100 percent of available funds, serving as many families in Franklin County as funding permits.

The Section 8 department expended 98% of available funds through end of year 2017.

10. Section 8 will expand the supply of assisted housing by applying for additional rental vouchers as funding of program permits.

Additional vouchers were applied for through the HUD-VASH program, receiving a letter of support for 5 additional vouchers. Additionally, HOME vouchers are continuing to be utilized through PHFA.

11. The Section 8 department will work with landlords throughout the county to bring more awareness and opportunities to participants in the program through outreach initiatives and educational seminars.

New landlords have been added to the program and continue to be a focus of the department. Outreach meetings occurred twice a year to provide knowledge and marketing opportunity to expand the available landlords available to participants.

11. The FCHA will serve the needs of child and adult victims of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault or stalking providing them protections under the VAWA Act.

- FCHA is committed to providing the protections of the VAWA Act.

12. FCHA will continue to work with the Public Housing residents to seek out new members and develop a strong Tenant Council Association.

- FCHA will continue to improve in this area and strive to have Tenant Council Associations in each AMP.

- 13. Offer a variety of housing options to participants in the Section 8 program; to include allocation of up to 20% of vouchers in the Project Based Voucher program.
 - FCHA is below the 20% of PBV vouchers but will look for opportunities to expand housing options utilizing these vouchers for the future.

14. Ensure organizational sustainability through succession planning.

- FCHA recently hired a new executive director and will continue staff development to ensure sustainability of programs.
- 15. Maximize staff performance in achieving goals and objectives through improved training and development opportunities for all staff members.
 - FCHA is committed to staff development through leadership training, educational opportunities and self development of employees.
- 16. Further development of leadership and management skills for our staff in leadership positions using the SERVE model.
 - FCHA has continued the development of leadership and management skills utilizing the SERVE leadership model and remains committed to this goal.

- 2. The Plan contains a certification by the appropriate State or local officials that the Plan is consistent with the applicable Consolidated Plan, which includes a certification that requires the preparation of an Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice, for the PHA's jurisdiction and a description of the manner in which the PHA Plan is consistent with the applicable Consolidated Plan.
- 3. The PHA has established a Resident Advisory Board or Boards, the membership of which represents the residents assisted by the PHA, consulted with this Resident Advisory Board or Boards in developing the Plan, including any changes or revisions to the policies and programs identified in the Plan before they were implemented, and considered the recommendations of the RAB (24 CFR 903.13). The PHA has included in the Plan submission a copy of the recommendations made by the Resident Advisory Board or Boards and a description of the manner in which the Plan addresses these recommendations.
- 4. The PHA made the proposed Plan and all information relevant to the public hearing available for public inspection at least 45 days before the hearing, published a notice that a hearing would be held and conducted a hearing to discuss the Plan and invited public comment.
- 5. The PHA certifies that it will carry out the Plan in conformity with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Fair Housing Act, section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, and title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.
- 6. The PHA will affirmatively further fair housing by examining their programs or proposed programs, identifying any impediments to fair housing choice within those programs, addressing those impediments in a reasonable fashion in view of the resources available and work with local jurisdictions to implement any of the jurisdiction's initiatives to affirmatively further fair housing that require the PHA's involvement and by maintaining records reflecting these analyses and actions.
- 7. For PHA Plans that includes a policy for site based waiting lists:
 - The PHA regularly submits required data to HUD's 50058 PIC/IMS Module in an accurate, complete and timely manner (as specified in PIH Notice 2010-25);

All required supporting documents have been made available for public inspection along with the Plan and additional requirements at the primary business office of the PHA and at all other times and locations identified by the PHA in its PHA Plan and will continue to be made available at least at the primary business office of the PHA.
